1. In Sept. 2023, What Did US Military Officials Turn to the Public for Assistance in Finding?

• A stealthy F-35B Lightning II jet.

On Sept. 18, 2023, the US Military lost an advanced F-35B Lightning II jet, a plane so stealthy that even they couldn't find it. • 400 years old

The Palace of Versailles was originally a modest hunting lodge <u>built by King Louis XIII in 1623</u>. It was later expanded and <u>transformed into a</u> <u>lavish royal residence by his son Louis XIV</u>, who moved the court and the government there in 1682. The palace witnessed many historical events, such as the signing of <u>the Treaty of Versailles that ended World War I</u> in 1919. To celebrate its 400th anniversary, <u>the palace has</u> <u>opened a gallery that retraces its history</u> with over 120 works. President Emmanuel Macron held <u>a grand dinner in the Hall of Mirrors for King</u> <u>Charles III and Queen Camilla</u> to celebrate the occasion on Sept. 20, 2023.

4. What is the Khalistan Movement?

• A movement seeking independence for Sikhs in Punjabi, India.

The Khalistan movement advocates for <u>an independent homeland for Sikhs in India's Punjab region</u>. While the idea of Khalistan has been around for a while, it made headlines in 2023 due to <u>the alleged assassination of Hardeep Singh Nijjar</u>, a prominent Canadian Sikh leader and Khalistan advocate. This incident led to <u>a diplomatic tiff between Canada and India</u>, with ambassadors expelled. Canada's Prime Minister, Justin Trudeau, even suggested there was <u>"credible evidence" of India's involvement in the assassination</u>.
