1. Michael Cohen, A Former Personal Attorney, Testified Against His Ex-Employer In New York In May 2024. Who Was This Ex-Employer?

Michael Cohen testified against Donald Trump, his former boss, in May 2024. Cohen claimed that Trump directed him to arrange payments to Stormy Daniels to prevent her from publicizing her affair with Trump, fearing it would jeopardize his 2016 presidential campaign. Cohen said the payments were meant to be concealed as legal fees, leading to charges of falsifying business records against Trump.

In May 2024, Georgia introduced a highly controversial law. This law demanded that non-governmental organizations and media outlets receiving over 20% of their funding from foreign sources register as "agents of foreign influence." The law, which mirrored similar legislation in Russia, was met with significant public protest and controversy. Critics argue that such laws are used to stifle opposition and civil society. Despite large-scale demonstrations in Tbilisi and sharp criticism from the European Union and local opposition, the Georgian parliament ratified the law. President Salome Zourabichvili opposed the law and vowed to veto it, but the Georgian parliament held enough majority to override her veto.

5. What Event Does This Portrait of King Charles III, Unveiled in May 2024, Commemorate?

- His 50 years as a Drapers' Company member

The portrait, painted by Jonathan Yeo, was commissioned to celebrate King Charles III's long-standing relationship with the Drapers' Company, which began half a century ago. This association isn't just about fancy dinners; the Drapers' Company is a historic trade organization for wool merchants that has evolved into a philanthropic body granting funds for various causes. This piece of artwork, capturing King Charles in the regal red uniform of the Welsh Guards, was first publicly viewed by Charles himself at Buckingham Palace on May 14, 2024, before its display starts from May 16 to June 14, 2024, at the Philip Mould Gallery in London. The life-size portrait includes symbolic elements like a butterfly, perhaps hinting at transformation and continuity.

6. What Nigerian Name Was Given to Meghan Markle During Her Nigeria Visit?

- Ifeoma

During her visit to Nigeria, Meghan Markle was embraced by the local culture and given the name "Ifeoma," which in Igbo means 'a treasured thing.' An audience member suggested this name during a women's leadership event co-hosted by Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala, a prominent Nigerian economist and the head of the World Trade Organization.

Roger Corman, often hailed as the "King of B-movies," had a profound impact on the film industry. He carved out a distinct niche in Hollywood by masterfully crafting low-budget B-movies that transcended typical genre expectations. But his influence extended far beyond his own films. Corman was a launching pad for some of the most illustrious careers in the film industry. Directors like Francis Ford Coppola, Martin Scorsese, James Cameron, and actors such as Jack Nicholson, Robert De Niro, and Peter Fonda all received significant early opportunities under Corman's guidance. His impact was recognized when he received an honorary Academy Award in 2009 for his remarkable contributions to filmmaking. Corman's death at his Santa Monica, California, home on May 9, 2024, marked the end of an era in Hollywood.

9. Why Is Fiona Harvey, The Real-Life Inspiration Behind 'Baby Reindeer's' Martha, Threatening to Sue Netflix?

Fiona Harvey's legal actions against Netflix and Richard Gadd are rooted in her claim that "Baby Reindeer" portrayed her under the guise of fiction in a light that has significantly damaged her reputation. She contends that the series exaggerated her interactions with Gadd, particularly the number of emails and letters sent, allegedly in the tens of thousands. Her intention to sue was confirmed in interviews and public statements.

Donald Glover, who masterfully blends his skills as an actor, writer, director, and musician, released his first album, "3.15.20," under his stage name, Childish Gambino, in March 2020. On May 11, 2024, Nemo from Switzerland clinched a memorable victory at the Eurovision Song Contest in Malmo, Sweden. Their genre-bending anthem, "The Code," which merges opera and pop rap elements, won amidst significant political controversy and protests linked to other participants.
